Lindfield Learning Village is a public school in New South Wales. Our innovative educational model is designed to create independent, resilient learners who possess the learning dispositions required for success in their life within and beyond school. We want to promote safe, sustainable and healthy ways to access LLV and this guide provides a summary of your public transport options.

Using public transport to get to LLV

School buses and public buses

- 565 Chatswood to Macquarie University service travels from Lindfield and Roseville Stations to the bus stop outside LLV
- Stand a few steps back from the edge of the road when waiting for the bus
- Make sure to hail the driver
- Let passengers off the bus before you board
- Stand for adults if the bus is full

Trains

- Roseville Station is 2.1km from the school (25 minute walk)
- Lindfield Station is 2.2km from the school (27 minute walk)

Apply for a School Opal Card | School Term Bus Pass

- Many school students are entitled to free travel on public transport between home and school.
- A Child/ Youth Opal Card entitles school students to half price travel on public transport in Sydney and surrounds.

Message from your Principal

Part of our Purpose at Lindfield Learning Village is to seamlessly integrate wellbeing strategies into the daily lives of students and staff at LLV. We are therefore committed to providing students with safe, easy and sustainable ways of getting to and from school.

LLV can be accessed by bus, which provides connections to train services at Lindfield, Roseville and Chatswood Stations. With a dedicated school bus stop directly adjacent to the school, travelling to and from LLV by public transport provides students a safe travel option to socialise with their friends, to gain independence as well as resulting in less reliance on parents and carers to drop-off and pick-up by car.

We are continuing to work with Transport for NSW with regard to bus services, and the more students catching the bus, the more services will improve.

Kiss and drop

- The K&D zone is located adjacent to the southern side of the school. This is for primary school students only.
- Vehicles turnaround using the loop at the end of the access road before entering the waiting area.
- License plate recognition technology is used to register cars that enter the K&D zone and processes which student it is associated with for pick up, to provide a safe environment.
- The K&D zone operates between 8.30 to 9.10am and 3.00 to 3.30pm and is supervised by staff.
- Car pooling with other students is a great way to minimise your journeys dropping-off and picking-up.
